### The Pastor's Searchlight—October, 2024: "The Strikeout King" (The One Year Book of Amazing Stories, R. Petterson)



George struck out on the baseball field and in life. He grew up in a rough-and-tumble neighborhood called Pigtown. By age seven, he was already sneaking copious amounts of beer from the tap in his dad's saloon. Maybe that's why he got in so much trouble. He was sent to St. Mary's Industrial School for Boys, a combination orphanage and reformatory. After twelve years in that home for wayward boys, a defining word appears on his record: **incorrigible**. But George could hit a ball farther than any other kid. After he broke almost every window in the neighborhood, a priest encouraged him to play baseball. If it hadn't been for Brother Matthias, George might have ended up in prison or the

gutter. Instead, he became one of the most recognizable names in sports history. To look at him, with his spindly legs and protruding beer belly, you would never guess that George was an athlete. You sure wouldn't know it from his lifestyle. Throughout his legendary career, he continually broke curfew—often showing up at game time hungover from drinking beer and downing a couple dozen hot dogs loaded with sauerkraut, mustard, and onions. If players today jack up their power with steroids, George diluted his with booze, women, and all-night poker games. Though he famously loved kids and performed outrageous acts of charity, his personal life was a mess of womanizing and debauchery. Yet no one ever hit the ball like George Herman Ruth. He did his amazing feats before steroids or elongated seasons that pad statistics. He did it half-drunk, bloated by gluttony, and slowed by carousing. Who can forget that game against the Cubs in the 1932 World Series when the Babe was down in the count? The Chicago fans were screaming insults when he calmly pointed to the center field fence. He hit the next pitch more than five hundred feet over that fence. His statistics are mind boggling. He held the record for home runs, with 60 in a single season, and 714 lifetime homers. In his amazing career he had 2,873 hits with 2,174 runs batted in. But what most folks don't know is that the Sultan of Swat also held the major league record for striking out. After he retired, his strikeouts off the field caught up with him too. He desperately wanted to manage a team, but his lifestyle was too toxic. Baseball owners' repeated refusals to hire him as a manager broke his heart. In 1948, this bigger-than-life hero was reduced to a shadow of his former self by cancer. When he died at age fifty-three, he was celebrated as the greatest hitter of all time. Few remembered how often he struck out at the plate and in life. What is true for the Babe goes for us, too. Either we will go for the fences or play it safe at the plate. Joe Sewell had the fewest strikeouts in a major league career, but who remembers Joe? You may strike out a lot if you go for the fences, but at least you'll hit a few home runs.
