The Pastor's Searchlight—December, 2024: "The Man Time Forgot" (The One Year Book of Amazing Stories, R. Petterson)



Some people are just lucky. Or maybe they deserve a second chance at life. Or better yet: God is the God of second chances. Just ask Cornealious "Mike" Anderson. He was unemployed and looking for an easy score when he and a buddy held up a Burger King manager making a night deposit. Mike was hiding out at his girlfriend's apartment when the police caught up with him. He was arrested and convicted of armed robbery. The judge gave him thirteen years in prison. But his attorney appealed the verdict, arguing that the evidence had been illegally seized. So Cornealious was out on a twenty-five-thousanddollar bond. It took two years for the case to get to the Missouri Supreme Court, where judges unanimously agreed that his rights were not violated, and he had to serve his sentence. But because

of a clerk's error at the Department of Corrections, Cornealious was never served with papers. He asked his attorney what he should do, and the lawyer told him that it was the responsibility of the state to arrest him. So he went on with his life. Only this time, he did it the right way: got married, started a family, built a successful business, became a model citizen and churchgoing man. He renewed his driver's license, registered his business, voted in elections, and listed his residence on documents. But it wasn't until thirteen years later, on the day he was scheduled to be released from prison, that a Department of Corrections computer revealed he had never been incarcerated. Cornealious was arrested by marshals at his home on July 23, 2013. The legal sparring went on for months. His lawyer argued that he should be released for time served. The attorney general responded, "The law is very clear: you don't get credit for time served when you are out on bail." When the national media picked up the story, people bombarded the attorney general's office with pleas for clemency. So the state bowed to public pressure and let Cornealious Anderson go free. The feel-good story of 2014 didn't last long. Six months later, he was arrested for second-degree robbery when a woman accused him of snatching her purse. Those who had championed his cause were heartbroken. But a thorough investigation discovered that he had an airtight alibi. It also found that police had used questionable procedures. The St. Louis circuit attorney's office publicly apologized for their shoddy handling of the case. For the third time in fourteen years, Cornealious "Mike" Anderson walked away from jail a free man. One might argue that his first time was luck. His second was because of a life well lived. His third was a case of mistaken identity. Or we could say that this is another story of amazing grace. Folks often complain that life isn't fair. The truth is that if God gave us what we really deserved, we would all be in big trouble. But God is the God of second, third, and a gazillion more chances. Cornealious might say amen to this truth:

God is never fair. Instead, God goes beyond fair to mercy.

"He does not punish us for all our sins; he does not deal harshly with us, as we deserve." (Psalm 103:10)

The amazing glory of our upcoming Advent/Christmas celebration is that God steps down from His heavenly throne to become a human infant...gurgling, cooing, crying, drool and messy "diapers," colic and spit-up...surrounded by the humble and plain setting of a manger with it's pastoral animals and all their barnyard odors and the chill of the night air. This is profound evidence of God's grace, mercy, and compassion for us, God's creation. We will be traveling through an Advent series entitled "The Word Made Flesh" beginning on Dec. 1. So please plan to join us as we begin that moving season together. We will also be doing the "Hanging of the Greens" after worship that Sunday! Please plan to help decorate!
