## The Pastor's Searchlight—April, 2025: "Lessons from the Concentration Camp" (The One Year Book of Amazing Stories.)

Some were Orthodox, others Hasidic, and still others secular. Among them were the fashionable and the threadbare, the scholar and the blue-collar worker, the socialite and the pauper, the beautiful and the plain. The showers were the great equalizer. Treasures were confiscated, heads shaved, and clothes exchanged for striped pajamas. They were marched lockstep to identical lice-infested bunks in identical barracks. The labor, hunger, and disease would eventually strip them of their last

distinguishing features: whether thin or fat, old or young, healthy or sickly—they'd all be reduced to the same skeletal grotesqueness. No one would have known that Victor Frankl was a prominent psychologist and neurologist in Vienna. During his journey through the horrors of Auschwitz and Kaufering concentration camps, he lost everything. When he was liberated, he discovered that his pregnant wife and most of his relatives had perished. Many Holocaust survivors became disillusioned with God or even gave up on the idea, that there was any ultimate meaning. Dr. Victor Frankl was not one of them. In 1959 he channeled his experiences in the death camps into an international bestseller, Man's Search for Meaning. He wrote the book in nine days, but it had been percolating in his mind for decades. Frankl said that the difference between those who survived the camps and those who didn't usually came down to one thing: meaning. He remembered a science teacher who said, "Life is nothing more than a combustion process, a process of oxidation." Frankl responded, "Sir, if this is so, what is the meaning of life?" He later noticed that those who saw transcendent meaning, even in the most horrific od circumstances, were the ones who triumphed over the horror. He said that the Nazis could take away all their freedoms but one: the freedom we all have to choose how we will respond to life. Victor Frankl became the most renowned psychologist in the postwar world. We must surely grieve for all the Holocaust took from him, but we can be equally grateful to Dr. Frankl for showing us that we can find sense even in the senseless. He was a prophetic voice when humanism and hedonism slowly stripped spiritual meaning from Western life. Before his death in 1997, he became increasingly concerned about the American search for happiness rather than meaning. He was certain that our narcissistic pursuit of pleasure was producing an epidemic of soul emptiness. Maybe we should dust off Man's Search for Meaning and read it again. The Library of Congress labeled it one of the ten most influential books in the United States. The amazing thing Frankl learned in the Nazi death camps applies to our postmodern "affluenza": those who put their hope in pleasure, power, peace, and prosperity soon died when they lost it. Those who found a transcendent meaning—even seeing God at work in terrible circumstances—found the will to survive and even triumph. Today you might want to think about something Frankl wrote:

# Our main motivation for living is our will to find meaning in life.

You guide me with Your counsel, leading me to a glorious destiny. Whom have I in heaven but You?

I desire You more than anything on earth. (Psalm 73:24-25)

In this nation and this culture currently, there seems to be an air of selfish focus with blinders on..."All I care about is me and mine." We are absolutely journeying through a season of complete chaos and the crisis of a threatened democracy. Victor Frankl would encourage us to remember that we are tasked with sharing a prophetic voice for justice, for "the least of these" and all those without a voice to speak for themselves. It is especially during times of chaos/struggle that God's miraculous presence and power become evident. As we approach Holy Week in 2025 (April 13-20), in the midst of Christ's journey through brokenness and the darkness of the human soul, may we have the courage to love, forgive, serve, and speak up for justice, no matter what it may cost us!! Jesus said, "Pick up your cross and count the cost." (Luke 14:25-30)
