The Pastor's Searchlight—May, 2025: "The Shantung Compound" (The One Year Book of Amazing Stories, R. Petterson)



Langdon was born in 1919, the son of a chaplain at the University of Chicago. After he graduated from Harvard University, he went to teach English in China, which was under Japanese rule at the time. When Japan bombed Pearl Harbor and the United States declared war, the Japanese began to round up citizens of Allied nations and cart them off to concentration camps. Langdon was sent to a former Presbyterian mission compound in the coastal province of Shantung. Some 1,500 prisoners were crammed into that pitifully small place. Most were pastors, priests, missionaries, and Christian educators. As concentration camps go, the Shantung Compound was relatively civilized. No prisoners

were beaten or tortured. But there was never enough food. Langdon lost fifty pounds, more than a third of his body weight. The biggest enemies were fear and boredom. Living space was at a premium. Privacy was almost nonexistent. Chalk lines were meticulously drawn to mark off personal space. For the next three years, inmates jealously quarded their few feet of real estate, ready to fight to the death if someone crossed the chalk line. Years later, Langdon Gilkey wrote a disturbing bestseller entitled **Shantung Compound** about his dismay at the conditions in the camp. Even the most devout missionaries were not immune to gross selfishness. Clergymen squabbled with other prisoners over food even as they stole from communal supplies. Veteran missionaries refused to share any portion of their living space with new arrivals. One preacher argues that he needed all his space to write his sermons. Hypocrisy was rampant. Fundamentalists refused to share their meals with people who smoked cigarettes, treating them like the worst sort of sinners. Yet those same preachers grabbed all the Red Cross cigarettes they could to barter for extra tins of food. In a camp full of missionaries, the only one who could be trusted to guard the communal food store was Dick Rogers, an alcoholic ex-soldier. But many a pious preacher, whose ration of food depended on Dick's strength of character, still considered him immoral because he drank. Langdon was most disillusioned when the Red Cross delivered 2,100 food parcels to the compound. The Japanese decreed that, because parcels came from the United States, each of the three hundred American prisoners would get first choice. The remaining 1,800 parcels were to be shared with the rest of the prisoners. But the American clergy caucused and formally protested that the Japanese were grossly unfair. They demanded that, because the parcels came from the American Red Cross, the three hundred US citizens should receive all of them! Young Langdon Gilkey almost lost his faith as a result of the moral failures of Christians in that camp. Some sixty years later, he reminds us all that the best of saints have sinful hearts. Sadly, they will often sacrifice everything to meet their own needs. On the other hand, he saw heroic Christians who sacrificed everything to help fellow prisoners. Langdon Gilkey's story teaches us an important truth:

You do not own what you refuse to give away to others. It owns you. Only when you freely give it away are you free.

Even though "I am allowed to do anything," I must not become a slave to anything. (I Corinthians 6:12)

"Young Langdon Gilkey almost lost his faith as a result of the moral failures of Christians in that camp." I will admit to you all that I found myself feeling like Langdon after the past election of 2024. I felt betrayed by the Christian community who seemed to have sold their soul to the devil. I have been battling my inner cynic, and asking God to change my attitude—to surrender my disappointment, my sorrow, my discouragement, and my rage into the Father's hands. I truly believe God has a bigger vision for our nation, and that He may allow our nation to collapse from within as a measure of holding us accountable for our enabling efforts to allow our nation to become a beacon not of justice, but injustice as we have failed our God by failing His vision of democracy which He began over 2,050 years ago! God will not be mocked! But know this...God will always welcome and forgive us back into His embrace when we repent!


